Exe Cycle Route

The Exe Cycle Route - a new traffic-free route - is part of the developing network of cycle routes in Exeter, one of England's oldest cities. It has a Norman cathedral begun in 1112 and an attractive university campus. The route follows the western bank of the River Exe from Exwick, linking to the City Centre by way of the new purpose-built Miller's Crossing bridge. It then continues southwards through Exeter's historic and attractive Quay, and then through the Riverside Valley Park

between the Exeter Canal and the river to the village of Exminster.

Route 2 will ultimately run down both sides of the Exe Estuary to the coast, and through Devon from Plymouth to the Dorset border, where it will continue along the south coast. As more of the route is completed it will become a significant tourist attraction, but in Exeter it is already being appreciated by local shoppers, commuters and students, as well as by visitors to the city.
