

## **2007 – 2008 Small Grants Scheme Overview**

**6696 young people** now have access to improved cycle and walking facilities due to the Small Grants Scheme funding.

### **Partnership involvement**

219 schools throughout Scotland applied for funding.

24 schools, from across 15 local authorities were allocated funding for their projects.

### **Summary of projects**

The majority of the projects funded were to install cycle storage. Other projects benefiting from funding included:

- Parent waiting shelters, Inveraray PS, Argyll and Bute, East Linton PS, East Lothian and Balbardie PS, West Lothian
- New footpath, Kirkcolm PS, Dumfries and Galloway
- Playground shelters, East Linton PS, East Lothian
- Scooter storage, Broomhill PS, Glasgow
- School Entrance improvements, Lady Alice PS, Inverclyde
- Entrance gates replacement, Greenloaning PS, Perth and Kinross
- Step and path improvements, Buchlyvie PS, Stirling
- Locker installations, Inveralmond Community High School, West Lothian

### **In summary:**

- **24 schools** benefited from physical infrastructure projects
- **38 scooter spaces** were installed
- **185 cycle parking spaces** were installed
- **4 waiting shelters** were installed. These will accommodate up to 65 people, including parents and carers who are travelling actively to school.
- **3 schools benefitted from new paths and entrances** which will also provide better access and safer routes for their wider communities
- **6696 young people** now have access to improved cycle and walking facilities due to the Small Grants Scheme funding

### **Funding allocated**

The total amount claimed for the Small Grants Schemes in 2007 - 2008 was **£46,365.64**
