Trans Pennine Trail



The Trans Pennine Trail is a 350 mile national route for recreation and transport. It provides a coast to coast facility linking the major towns and cities across the North of England from Liverpool to Hull and Leeds to Chesterfield. The whole trail is for walkers and cyclists with many sections having easy access for people with disabilities and particularly suitable for families. Many miles are available for horse riders.

Sustrans - the sustainable transport charity - works on practical projects to encourage people to walk, cycle and use public transport in order to reduce motor traffic and its adverse effects.

As well as the National Cycle Network, Sustrans is working on Safe Routes to Schools, home zones and other practical responses to the transport and environmental challenges we face. Sustrans' work relies on the generous donations and monthly standing orders of nearly 40,000 Supporters, and the support of charitable trusts, companies, the National Lottery and local authority programmes.

The National Cycle Network is a comprehensive network of safe and attractive routes to cycle throughout the UK. 10,000 miles are due for completion by 2005, one third of which will be on traffic-free paths, the rest will follow quiet lanes or traffic-calmed roads. It is delivered through the policies and programmes of over 450 local authorities and other partners, and is co-ordinated by the charity Sustrans.

Code of conduct for greenways

Motorbikes are not permitted on the path.

Walkers if you are walking with a dog, please keep it on a lead at all times, and clear up any mess.

Cyclists please don't expect to cycle at high speeds

- be prepared to slow down or stop if necessary
- be careful at junctions, bends and entrances
- give way to walkers, wheelchair users and horse riders - leave them plenty of room
- remember that some people cannot hear or see well - don't assume that they can
- fit a bell and use it - don't surprise people
