Even if you have no particular destination in mind, these routes provide you with a great opportunity to get out into the fresh air and get active, either on foot or on your bike, without having to worry about busy noisy traffic. Try one of our suggested circuits today!

The route along the southern edge of the Marsh Farm area forms part of National Route 6 of the National Cycle Network, which currently extends westward to Houghton Regis, Dunstable and Stanbridge and will eventually link all communities between Milton Keynes, Leighton Buzzard, Luton and London.

The National Cycle Network is a comprehensive network of safe and attractive routes to cycle throughout the UK. 10,000 miles are due for completion by 2005, one third of which will be on traffic-free paths the rest will follow quiet lanes or traffic-calmed roads. It is delivered through the policies and programmes of over 450 local authorities and other partners, and is co-ordinated by the charity Sustrans.
