

Update Slip for map NN6b – Derby to York Cycle Route

The following sections of route have changed since the map was published.

Panel 1 – National Route 6 to the south branches off at the Millenium Mile Post (at the 2 mile mark) and is traffic-free to Worthington towards Leicester.

Panel 1 – Proposed traffic-free section between Borrowash and Breaston now OPEN (follow orange dots)

Panel 1 – Between Long Eaton and the centre of Nottingham there have been a number of improvements to the route. Search on 'Long Eaton'.

Panel 4a – National Route 67 through Sheffield. A traffic-free route now avoids the busy Ecclesfield Road. Instead of turning onto Barrow Road you will be signed to carry on along the path running between the river, motorway and railway. Search on 'Blackburn' and choose the Sheffield option. You will also notice that the more direct route to Hoyland now avoids the B6086

Panel 5 – The proposed routes (marked with orange dots) are now open between Bentley and Thorpe in Bain and between Braithwaite and Snaith. The Earth Centre is now closed

Panel 6 – The proposed route to the east of the airfield at Burn is now open.
