How to find Sustrans Scotland

Sustrans encourages its staff and visitors to walk, cycle and use public transport where possible, as part of a healthy lifestyle.

Union Street is just off the top of Leith Walk, on the left as you head away from the city centre, opposite The Playhouse. Glenorchy House is on the left-hand side of Union Street, at the foot of the hill (*please be aware that the building numbers on Union Street run out of sequence – No 20 is past the opening for Forth Street*). It is within easy walking distance of Waverley train station and Edinburgh bus station - see the attached map.

On foot

Waverley train station is approximately 5 minutes walk away and Haymarket train station approximately 25 minutes. St. Andrew Square bus station is also a 5 minute walk away.

By bicycle

The Sustrans office is just to the east of National Cycle Route 75. Cycle parking is located at the rear of the office. For more details of the National Cycle Network, go to www.sustrans.org.uk, click on 'Get Cycling', go to the 'Plan Route' tool and enter the office postcode.

By bus

Bus routes 7, 10, 11, 12, 14, 16, 22, 25 and 49 all run down Leith Walk – get off at Elm Row. The number 8 and 17 Lothian Bus routes run down Broughton Street, a short distance from Union Street. For more information about buses, go to www.lothian-buses.co.uk.

By taxi

There are taxi ranks at the train stations and at the bus station.

Getting to the area

By public transport

Main line **trains** from England serve Waverley station and many West Coast mainline trains stop at Haymarket. Most services within Scotland serve Waverley and Haymarket Stations. **Buses** throughout Scotland serve St Andrew Square Bus Station. Park and Ride

There are five Park and Ride sites, at Ferry Toll (north of the Forth Road Bridge), Ingliston to the west, Hermiston to the south west, Todhills to the south east and Newcraighall to the east. All are served by buses into central Edinburgh. More details and a map can be found at:

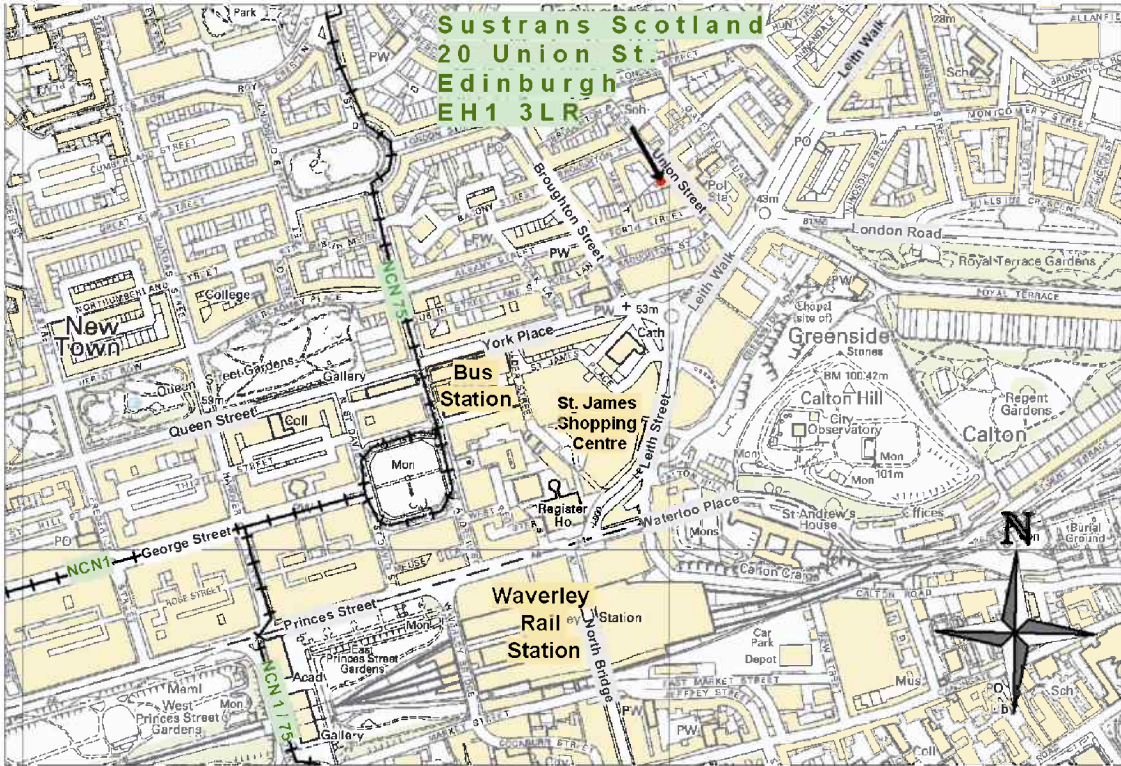

By car

We encourage sustainable transport, but recognise that for some journeys a car may be necessary. On-street parking in central Edinburgh is limited and expensive. There is car parking available on Greenside Place, next to the Omni complex on Leith Street, and under the St James Shopping Centre off York Place.
