Tried and tested solutions

Strong public support is pivotal to the success of a School Street. Our established and effective approach starts with a School Street trial and community engagement, taking the time to understand local needs and concerns. We use walkabouts, workshops, surveys and low-cost temporary interventions to meaningfully engage with the whole school community, including children.

We work with local authorities to set up School Street Trials using experimental or temporary traffic regulation orders. Trials are a valuable opportunity to engage with the whole school community, to allow families to experience safer walking, wheeling and cycling on the school run and to shape any permanent scheme. During the trial, we monitor and evaluate the impact of the School Street and support the community to feed into a formal consultation process.

Community insights shape our plans. We use the co-design approach to develop School Street designs shaped by community insights. Input from the people who will use it improves ownership and increases the chance of long-term success.

Delivering behaviour change engagement to enable more people to build active travel habits.

Leading School Street Trials to develop community-backed proposals for permanent School Streets.

How we'll work with you

Building positive, lasting partnerships with local authorities is the bedrock of our approach. We bring insight, experience and a solution-focused, collaborative way of working to every School Street project, establishing a clear plan, responsibilities and expectations from the outset.

We'll work with you to assess the individual circumstances of each school and the feasibility of different options for traffic restriction. We can advise on local strengths and opportunities. And help you to identify and overcome challenges you may face, from local opposition to limited funding.

We have experience of delivering School Street trials using a range of temporary traffic filters. Some use moveable barriers stewarded by volunteers. Others test interventions such as bollards, planters and swing gates or introduce automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) technology.



What we need from you

We want your School Street Trial to succeed, creating a safer neighbourhood around the school and changing the way people travel.

To achieve this, we ask you to identify a committed lead within your local authority to work with us. Funding will need to be in place. We'll also need to know whether there is potential for trial schemes to become permanent or lead to further funding.

Evidence of an appetite for School Streets at the schools involved, and time and resources dedicated to community engagement throughout the project are also essential.

Examples of our work



We're working with Frome Town Council in Somerset on an ambitious School Streets Trial covering four schools and a nursery.

We began by carrying out in-depth community engagement, including inperson events, online workshops and surveys of adults and young people. Our team of urban designers and engineers used this feedback to produce co-designed proposals for change across the areas. These included infrastructure changes, such as connecting cycling and walking routes, improving crossings, parking and traffic restrictions and enforcement.

We also worked with local groups to encourage and enable more people to walk, wheel and cycle to help the scheme have the biggest impact. The 18-month School Street trial began in 2024 and may become permanent depending on data and feedback.
